From the Pastor:

I had the opportunity to spend a few minutes with a friend who is a piano tuner and technician. As I watched him work and describe his procedures, I was reminded how wonderfully complex a piano really is. There are many, many different (and moving) parts as well as felt cloth and strings of different size and composition. Some function only occasionally, while some are tuned to a perfect balance of stress and stability.

There are numerous ways in which a piano needs to be maintained. Of course the strings need to be tuned, but the myriad moving parts need to be fit and adjusted exactly right or the instrument won't sound as intended. My friend is a true master, having worked on the best pianos for almost fifty years. His expertise and touch can bring life and purpose to an instrument that is all but a wreck.

The Church also has lots of moving parts, people, who are operating under different conditions and in different locations. We, too, need adjustment sometimes. It's easy for us to get out of tune—with God and each other. If we won't allow God to fit us together the way He knows is best we won't function properly. And if we don't function properly we won't sound as we were created to—singing the beautiful and eternal harmony of God's Sacred Story.
